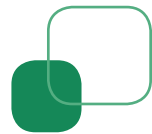

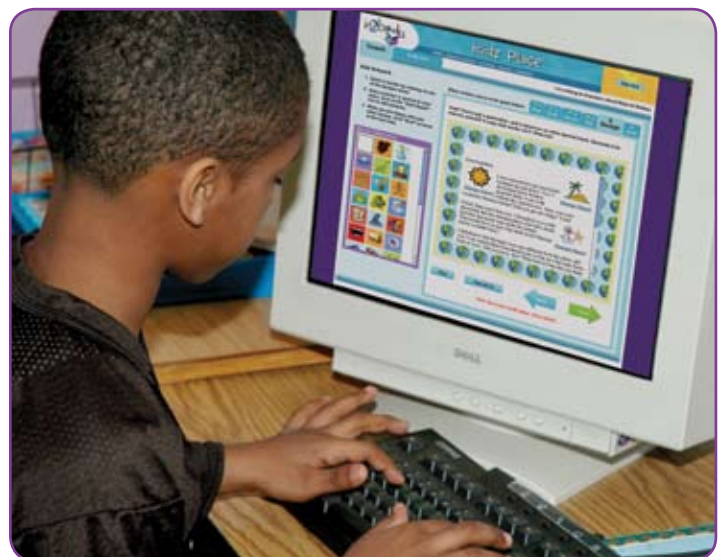

In2Books has been used successfully both in classrooms with basal curricula and in less structured learning environments.

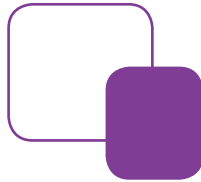
- Students are matched with adult pen pals.

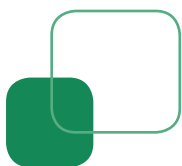

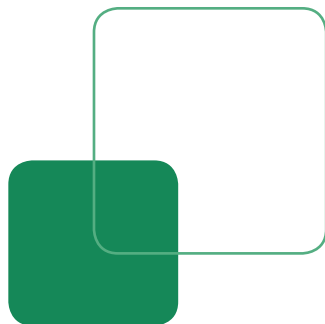
