Activating Prior Knowledge

Graffiti Wall

Graffiti Walls welcome students to share their background knowledge by visually representing what they already know about a key concept on a large, blank canvas.

- 1. Provide students with a large, blank paper and colorful writing tools. (bulletin board paper, poster board, chalkboard, dry erase board)
- 2. Invite students to visually represent (words, pictures, symbols) what they know about a topic.
- 3. As a whole group, review the wall and allow students to share and explain their contributions.
- 4. Leave the graffiti wall up during the unit of study for students to add newly acquired knowledge.

Extension:

Sidewalk Chalk: Add some fun by going outside and having students list what they already know about a topic with sidewalk chalk. Then take a class walk around and read aloud students' written sharing.
