Change



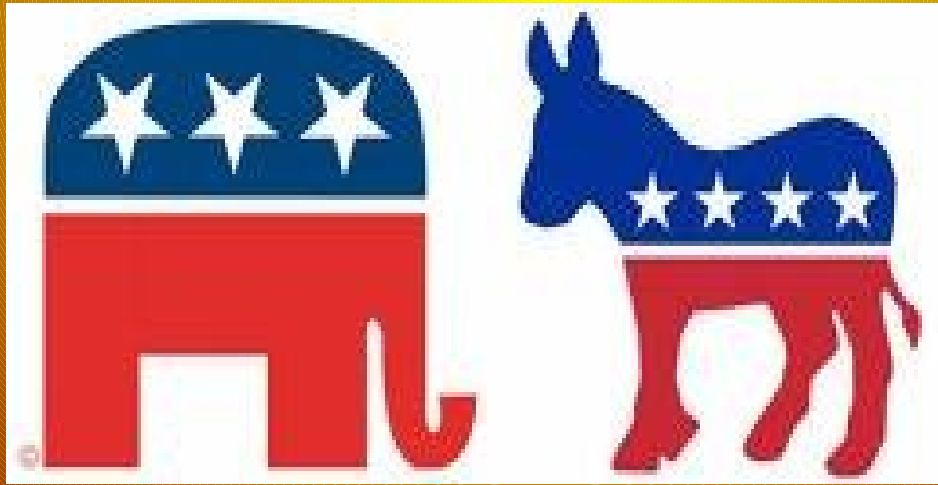
